3.	Paper III English Essay on a legal topic.	3 hours	100 marks
4.	Paper IV Punjabi Essay on a social topic	3 hours	100 marks
5.	Paper V General knowledge objective type multiple choice 25 questions. Each question shall carry 2 marks. There shall be no negative marking.	1 hours	50 marks
