Trees support man's life by supplying the atmosphere with oxygen, which is essential to life. The oxygen in the air is constantly being used up and turned into carbon dioxide when animals breathe and things burn. Carbon dioxide is the food that plants consume. The green leaves of trees and plants absorb this carbon dioxide and with the help of sunlight break it down into carbon and oxygen. The carbon is used to make starch, and the oxygen is released into the air, so replacing the oxygen used up by animals. But for this, animals would soon die for lack of oxygen.

Starch and other carbon compounds made in green leaves of trees and plants serve as food for animals. The tiny green cells of plants are wonderful laboratories, which produce all the starch in the world. But for this service done by plants, all animals would sooner or later die for lack of food; they must get all their food either directly from plants or indirectly by eating animals that have fed on plants. You must have noticed how on a hot day it is often cooler under a tree than inside a building. This is because the leaves of trees breathe out a lot of water vapour and this helps to cool the air, more or less as a mud pot cools the water in it. In this way forests help to cool the atmosphere and the rain clouds passing through it, so causing rain where new forests have been planted, rainfall is known to have increased.

NASA's MARS Odyssey spacecraft has found evidence that vast regions of Mars may abound in water - a discovery that bolsters the theory that life once existed on the Red Planet.

The water is believed to be ice mixed in with the dirt, dust and rock that form the top 3 feet of the planet's surface, according to initial data released on Friday.

The water probably accounts for just a few per cent by mass of the surface of Mars, but covers a vast area that stretches from the frozen southern polar cap northward to about 60 degrees south latitude.

"The signal we have been getting loud and clear is there is a lot of ice on Mars", said William Boynton of the University of Arizona at Tucson. He is the chief scientist for the spacecraft instrument that measures the abundance of hydrogen, a likely indicator of the presence of water.

Scientists have long known that there is water on Mars. However, the suggestion that it is present in such quantities could bolster the theory that the planet could have harbored life. Water is considered necessary for life.

The results, the first science data from Odyssey, were presented at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) which manages the \$300 million mission. "The results are exceeding our expectations," said Roger Gibbs, Odyssey deputy project manager from JPL.

Odyssey, even though it is less than two weeks into a mapping mission expected to last at least 917 days, is already changing scientists' view of the planet.

The spacecraft is intended to map the chemical and elemental makeup of the Mars and hunt for water and hot springs that could indicate geothermal activity.
